Facilitating Boundary Crossing

Information-Centric Online Communities

- Encourage, facilitate linking
- Encourage, engage in interactions
- Encourages emergence of common social norms, information values, information behaviours
- Leads to greater information sharing

Scientific Collaboration

- Successful juggling, bridging, adapting
- Integrate new and preexisting norms, types, values, behaviours
 - Continued practice of scientific collaboration
 - Continued information sharing
- Look for, engage with collaborators as structural bridges (Hara et al., 2003)
