

- Survey of users (n = 142)
 - Individualized cognitions of behavior
 - Strong, significant role in users' information behavior
- Semi-structured interviews (n = 11)
 - Behaviors, needs
 - Use of site, groups
 - Shared (or unshared) social context

Resolving Tension

- Synthesis of nuances, facets
- Deeper, richer conclusions

 Information behavior plays a clear role, but not always manifest

"Fit" as boundary object, site for existing behaviors Users

Technology for full spectrum of features, behaviors
